

Strangulation & Sexual Assault

Strangulation is a form of asphyxia caused by an external force of pressure applied to the neck.

Symptoms of Strangulation:

- Memory loss and headaches
- Petechiae (red, brown or purple spots on the skin and eyes)
- Broken or fractured bones
- Swelling (including swollen tongue)
- Vision and hearing changes
- Ligature marks, redness, bruising
- Nausea
- Vocal cord immobility

Non-fatal strangulation is the greatest single risk factor for future homicide (attempted and completed)

97% of victims who report strangulation report that it was a manual strangulation
